Messages from the Office:

Parking: We have received many complaints of a Aboyne parent parking across the pedestrian crossing every day opposite school. Please can we ask that you do not park here as you are making it unsafe for families to cross the road. The parking permits issued by school mean you can only park in bays and NOT on yellow lines.

To do this, we will need to see some ID, ideally your driving licence, passport and current years' council tax bill. Please bring the originals to the office so we can start the process. You will also need to get a character reference (Forms available from the office)

UPDATE – Once you have received your DBS certificate, please bring it into the office as we have one final check to do. Thank you.

- 3. <u>RETURN THE ARTWORK FORM TO THE SCHOOL OFFICE ON MONDAY 1 NOVEMBER.</u> If you do not return the artwork form to school by then, the printers will not be able to create your items.

Here is a bit more about the puddings:




Finally, they come with a bespoke Aboyne Lodge label (designed by Aboyne mum Sarah Shaw) and make great Christmas presents.
