On Tuesday, we attended the St Albans Civic Society Commercial Design Awards. The school was commended in the Community category for the refurbishment and described Aboyne as an "iconic, pioneering, Grade 2 listed Hertfordshire System School...[Aboyne] has undergone a sensitive refurbishment. Its dignity is restored alongside the wonderful airiness of its classrooms". While we didn't win the main prize, it was lovely to see that the school has been recognised as a wonderful teaching space.
